Booking your Accommodation

1. Go to the Bed & Breakfast page
<https://www.jesus.ox.ac.uk/visit-us/bedandbreakfast/>
2. Scroll to the bottom and click **'Book Your B&B Stay Here +'**
3. Enter the promotion code **KX71472** and select the **arrival and departure date**.
4. Press **'search'**
5. Choose the room type that you would like to book
6. Book and pay for the rooms.

Troubleshooting:

- Please note that the **rooms will only show when the code has been entered** into the promotions box.
- You will need to add an arrival and departure date in the booking window **before** pressing **"search"**.
- If you are looking for a double occupancy room and there is not one available on the website, please contact conference.office@jesus.ox.ac.uk.

Travel

The entrance to Jesus College is on **Turl Street**, through a set of large wooden gates (see pictures below). The Porters' Lodge is manned 24/7, however the gates are locked at 5pm. If you arrive after this time, please press the buzzer to the left of the gates and a Porter will let you in.

Travelling by Train

Oxford Railway Station is a stop on a number of train routes, including trains coming from **London Paddington Station**. The station is a short distance from the Oxford City Centre, where Jesus College is located.

There are a number of methods to get to Jesus College from the train station:

- **Walking (15 mins)**
 - Turn right out of the station entrance, then take a right towards **Hythe Bridge**. At the mini roundabout, turn left onto **Park End St**, then follow the street to **Hythe Bridge Street**. Continue down the street and over the bridge.
 - Once over Hythe Bridge, cross the road at the pedestrian crossing onto **George Street** (towards Nando's).
 - Continue to the end of George Street, then cross onto **Broad Street**. Please take care crossing here as it is a busy junction.
 - Walk along Broad Street, past The Store Hotel and Balliol College. Take a right onto **Turl Street**.
 - The entrance to Jesus College is halfway down the street (past Knoop's) on the right-hand side.

- **Taxi (5 mins)**
 - We recommend using **001 Taxis** <https://www.001taxis.com/>, or **Royal Cars** <https://royal-cars.com/>
 - Taxis are permitted to drop off on **Broad Street** or on the **High Street**, which are both around a minute walk from the college.

- **Bus (5-10 mins)**
 - The **No 5 bus** picks up from directly outside the train station and will drop you at the top of **St Aldates**, which is less than a 5-minute walk from college.
 - From St Aldates, walk forward into **Cornmarket Street**, turning right into **Market Street**. At the bottom of Market Street turn left - the entrance into Jesus College is on your **left-hand side**, through the big **wooden gates**.

Travelling by Plane

If travelling to Oxford via **Heathrow or Gatwick Airport**, the **Oxford Airline Bus** is the most convenient option to get into the Oxford City Centre. The service runs **24/7/365**, and offers frequent transfers to and from Oxford. **Tickets must be booked in advance.**

Parking - Oxford Park and Ride Sites

If you are travelling to Oxford by car, we **highly recommend** the **Oxford Park and Ride sites** as they are one of the cheaper options, and have regular buses to the city centre.

Buses from these Park and Rides run regularly from around 6am to 11pm, Monday to Saturday. On Sundays, they run from 8.30am to 7pm (check the website for exact times).

Bus journeys take around **15 minutes** and will drop you on **George Street, High Street** or **St Aldates** depending on where you have come from.

Zero Emission Zones, Congestion Charge and Bus Gates in Oxford

Oxford has a **Zero Emission Zone (ZEZ) pilot in its city centre**, charging most petrol/diesel vehicles (even hybrids) £2-£10 daily, with only fully electric cars travelling free.

Alongside this, a separate **£5 congestion charge** affects six key roads, acting as a precursor to future traffic filters, with only residents and some essential workers qualifying for free permits or passes.

There are also several **bus gates** around the centre of Oxford whereby only buses are permitted to pass. Any motorists passing through bus gates are recorded by cameras and are subject to a **£75 fine**.

If travelling to Oxford by car, we highly recommend parking at the Park and Ride Sites to avoid fines!

Arrival at The Lodge

Arrival and check-in

The Jesus College entrance Lodge is located in Oxford City Centre just off the High Street, on **Turl Street, OX1 3DW**.

On arrival, please quote the reason for your visit and your full name to The Lodge staff, who will issue you with room keys then direct you accordingly. You can also pick up a map from The Lodge to help guide you.

Rooms are usually available **from 2pm** on the day of your planned arrival.

The Lodge is staffed 24 hours a day. Guests arriving after 5pm can access the College by ringing the doorbell, and a member of staff will unlock the gate.

Payment

If you have chosen to pay for your stay upon arrival, we accept payment by all **cards (except American Express)** or by **cheque**. Should you experience any issues completing payment, you will be issued an invoice, which will be available to be settled by bank transfer.

Extra assistance

Please notify us in advance if you have mobility difficulties, and require assistance with your luggage.

If required, the lodge can store your luggage on the day of arrival and departure.

General Information

WiFi

NB in order to access the Wi-Fi you must enter a valid email address.

Toiletries

Guests are politely advised that the **College no longer provides toiletry/amenity packs for guest rooms**. Our sustainability targets commit us to removing single use plastic from our operations wherever possible. We recognise that, on occasion, guests will find themselves short of essential toiletries and, therefore, we have these available in the Lodge for such circumstances.

Drinking water around college

If a "**No Drinking Water**" sign is displayed, please be assured that the water remains safe for all personal hygiene purposes including showering, handwashing, and brushing teeth. The notice simply means the water should not be used for drinking unless boiled in a kettle.

There is a water station available **24/7 by staircase XVIII (18) in third quad**. A water tap is also accessible in the **servery** and **Cheng Building Café** when open during mealtimes.

Fire Procedures

Please familiarise yourself with the fire evacuation instructions, and respond to any alarms in a timely fashion. Assembly Point is in First Quad by the Lodge.

Full details on evacuation routes and your muster point can be found on the back of your door.

Fire Testing takes place **every Tuesday between 9 am 10am**.

Housekeeping (9.20am – 4.00pm)

Your **bins will be emptied on a daily basis** and **linen changed every three days**.

In order to protect the environment, we ask guest to reuse their towels wherever possible, and we will **usually change on the third day**, or on the specified day indicated in the room literature. **If you require fresh towels**, please **leave them in your shower tray** and the housekeeping team will replace them.

If you do not want the housekeeping team to enter your room, please display the **'Do Not Disturb'** sign provided.

If you have a **welcome tray** in your room, this will be serviced on a **daily basis**.

Breakfast

During Term:

Monday-Friday: 8-9am - Hot and continental breakfast.

Saturday: 10-11am - the usual breakfast offering will be replaced by brunch.

Sundays: a packed breakfast will be prepared for you, and will be available to collect via the lodge reception.

Out of term:

Breakfast is served in the **Dining Hall** between **8am and 9am**. There may be rare occasions (particularly on Sundays) when for operational purposes, a self-service takeaway breakfast will be offered as an alternative. This will be communicated to guests in advance.

Check-out

All guests must leave their rooms and return their keys to the lodge by 10am on the day of departure.
